Why Attend & Present at the Colorado MPD Annual Meeting?

The Colorado Mineral Processing Division Subsection of the Society of Mining and Metallurgical Engineers (SME) had its first meeting in 1949 at The BroAdmoor in Colorado Springs, Colorado. The meeting is the longest running “annual” meeting in the history of The BroAdmoor.

The intent and structure of the meeting has always been to provide a comfortable venue in which participants could attend technical sessions in an informal setting. The design of the program was such that it would attract people from a wide range of disciplines within the mineral beneficiation community and foster camaraderie for all. Themes and Topics of the meeting and technical papers are adjusted annually to be relevant to the current challenges facing the mining industry, while staying within the general topic of “Mineral Processing”.

In 2021, for the ninth year (2020 was not held due to COVID), the Committee invited students from U.S. schools with Extractive Metallurgy and Mining Programs to give a presentation of their work. Through an interview and selection process by the MPD Student Committee three students were invited to present at the meeting and compete for best student presentation.

As we have all adjusted to the new realities of public health precautions amid the pandemic, so too has the Colorado MPD. In 2022 we are planning to return to the normal conference format while following applicable public health safeguards guidance from State and Local agencies.

The Executive Committee will again this year invite three students from U.S. Mineral Engineering schools to present during the conference. The Executive Committee is soliciting for a student presenter from your school, preferable a junior, senior, or graduate student. Please distribute this letter and the application form to your students and colleagues. If there is a group project please select one candidate to present. Student presenters will be provided re-imbursement for reasonable transportation and accommodations. Conference registration and meal event fees will also be waived. The best of the three presentations as judged by the Student Committee will win a \$3,000 award while the other two student presenters will be awarded \$1000 at the annual awards ceremony dinner.
